**FIRST LESSON**            II Samuel 7: 1-11, 16    *(seated)*

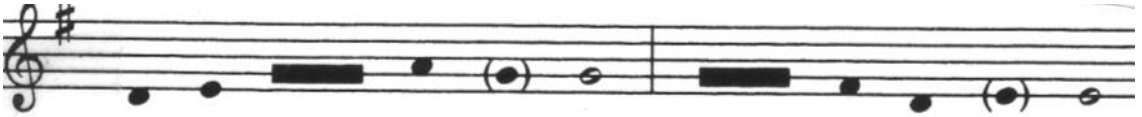

I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. 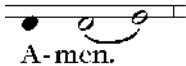


