*Celebrant* Our King and Savior draweth nigh:

**People** **O come, let us adore him.**

*As the Advent Candle is lit, all pray together:*

**All** **Lord, grant us your light, that being rid of the darkness of our hearts, we may come to the true light which is Christ.**

**The Collect of the Day**

*Celebrant* The Lord be with you.

**People** **And also with you.**

*Celebrant* Let us pray.

Almighty God, give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

**People** **Amen.**

*\*Note: On each of the four Sundays in the Season of Advent a new candle is lit. Each candle symbolizes the sacred gifts God freely gives to us in Christ, which are Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.*

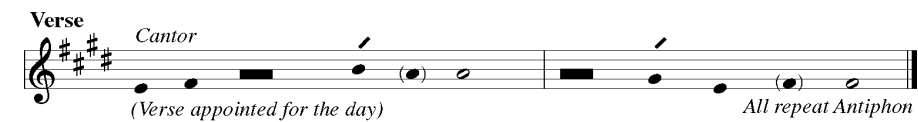

**People** **Amen.**
